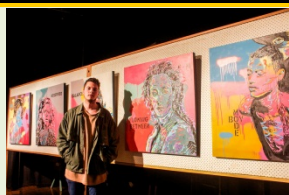
School Performance

- Epping finished 72nd in the state based on results
- 79 individual Year 12 students in 31 different subjects and levels of study received 90% or more 200 times in the 2014 HSC
- Benchmark results, when compared to the rest of the state, occurred in Modern History; Drama; Earth and Environmental Science; English Advanced; VET Hospitality examination; Software Design and Development; and History Extension
- All History Extension students achieved top Band results (E4)
- 4 boys in a class of 8 received Band 6 in Music 1

The project, a Japanese style cabinet, is made from New Guinea rosewood and had an accompany design folio

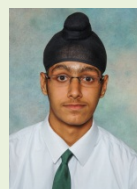

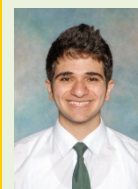

- 192 students sat the HSC and there were 165 university offers and 6 International students were offered university places
