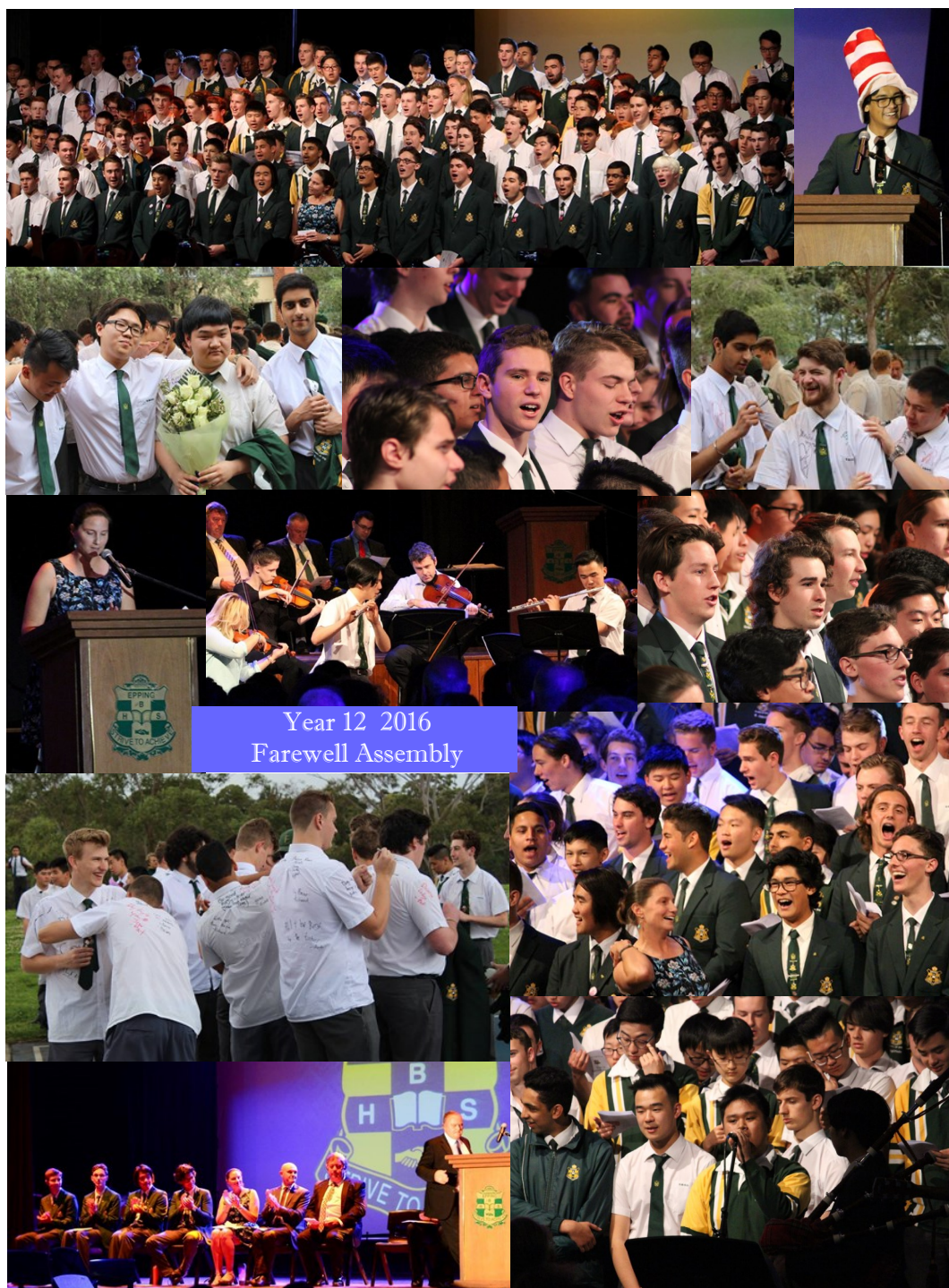
From the Principal – Tim O'Brien

After two weeks of being in holiday mode, we have returned for the challenges that a very busy final term present. After 2 days, the memory of holidays seemed so far away!! It is comforting to know that something that doesn't fade, like the memory of holidays, is the positive and supportive learning environment at Epping Boys where every student is valued and safe.

Year 12: The HSC began on Thursday, October 13. We have 195 boys sitting the HSC this year and feedback from the English papers was "the first one was okay, the second one a bit tougher" I hope that the remaining exams receive equally "high praise".

Year 11: At the end of the first week of Term 4, our large 2017 HSC cohort (233 boys) had a study skills day which rotated around 9 sessions designed to enhance the boys' approaches to study. These covered areas of "Study Skills and Habits", "Organising Notes/Note-taking, Working Smarter and Learning Styles", "Improving Writing and Reading to Remember", "Balance/Stress and Support", "Overcoming Procrastination and Time Management", "Excellence and Personal Best", "Growth-Mindset", "Careers". Thanks go to all teachers involved. Thanks also to the Prefects for organising the BBQ lunch.

In Period 4, there was a full year meeting where the boys received their HSC Assessment Schedule booklet, HSC Rules and Regulations booklet, EBHS Student Policy booklet. The boys were also spoken to about the mentor program and the jersey orders. At this meeting the boys were given advice on what to do in the case of Illness/Misadventure forms, the meaning of 'N' Awards in course, punctuality to class, school and attendance in class during assessment periods, and a variety of other essential information.

A reminder that reports for Year 11/12 will be handed out on October 25 and the Parent/Teacher Evening is on October 27 for parents to discuss Preliminary Exam results and the HSC course of 2017. No student in Year 11/12 has been allowed to drop a subject until this discussion with teachers has taken place and the boys will also have an interview with the Principal. We welcome 3 new students into Year 11/12 for their HSC study and hope they enjoy their year of study with us.

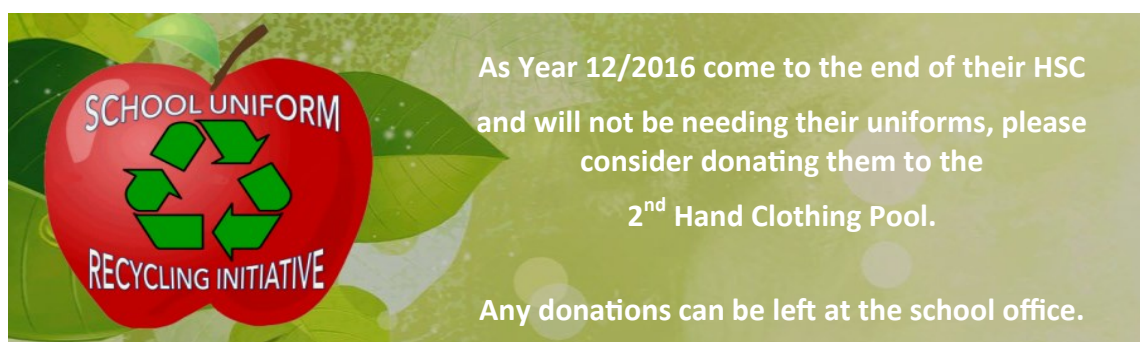
Year 10: Yearly Exams in most subjects will be held in Week 6 (14th-18th November). It is important that the boys prepare themselves with regular revision before the exams and by asking their teachers for clarification on areas they do not understand or need more assistance with prior to the exams. A study plan leading up to the exams is important as this sets good precedents for the coming Stage 6 studies. A reminder also that boys can only take a clear pencil case/plastic sleeve into their tests with their writing equipment (this is similar to the HSC requirements). Black pens only to be used.

It has come to my attention that there has been an increase in malpractice in assignments in Year 10 with boys looking for the quick and short alternative to doing the work themselves. This is not only very sad to hear but also an extremely bad ethic to attempt to claim someone else's work as their own. Copying large amounts of information from the internet will result in 0 marks as a requirement of study in assessments is that work is original. This applies to all years in the Senior School. Parents will be informed via "N" award warning letters that this has taken place and the student will be required to resubmit the work, done honestly and fairly. This will still receive a 0 mark but will allow the student to satisfy the outcomes and requirements of the course and show that they have eventually worked with due diligence.

Transition from year 6 to 7

The transition process from year 6 to year 7 is extremely important. Effective transition can reduce student anxiety about moving to a bigger school with more personal challenges and responsibility. Some of these challenges include,

- Students move from having between 1 and 3 teachers to between 8 and 14 teachers.
- Students need to pack their bag with the books and equipment for their timetabled classes each day.
- Students need to move to different rooms across the school at the end of each period to find their next class.
- Students go from being one of the oldest students in the school to being one of the youngest
- Students become part of a much bigger cohort of students
- Students may know only a few other students from their primary school and
- Student workload increases

We as adults would have memories of this transition when we were students. This memory will be different for everyone and of course each person deals with this challenge in different ways. Some find it easy and cannot wait to get to high school, while others find it stressful and full of uncertainty.

At Epping Boys High School we have a team of staff who focus on ensuring that your son's transition to high school is a positive one. Our team is made up of the Deputy Principal Middle School, the Head Teacher Middle School, the Year Adviser for the students coming into year 7, the School Counsellor, the English as another language or Dialect Teacher, the Learning and Support Teacher and because we have an autism unit, (what we call our Inclusive Education unit) the head teacher of Inclusive Education. As a team/school we want to understand the individual needs of each student coming to Epping Boys High School. We work closely with our partner primary school to build positive mutually beneficial partnerships that promote effective sharing of Information around students' needs and past learning experiences to ensure that we can cater for students needs and improve the continuity of learning from primary to high school.

During 2016 we worked with primary school to develop a scaffold to provide important information about a student's academic, social and wellbeing needs. The scaffold also provides details of topics studied, books read and technology that students are familiar with so that EBHS can build on what has already been covered in primary school.

We promoted and hosted a sharing afternoon to better coordinate information sharing to support student transition to high school. This afternoon was attended by representatives from both local high schools and primary school, allowing them to learn about students who will be transitioning to their school in 2017.

Another aspect that promotes effective transition to high school is the development of opportunities for high school students to work with primary school students. Epping Boys High School has worked with its partner primary schools to establish a number of opportunities to work with the primary schools. Some examples include,

Physical Activity and Sports Studies, (PASS) in year 10 help to run primary school carnivals.

Game design workshops for primary school students run by students studying Information Software and Technology, (IST).

High school students reading to primary school students

Mentoring days led to raise awareness and change behaviours around bullying and School Representative Council, (SRC) leaders mentor primary students at leadership camps.

This process works as a result of teachers hard work and commitment and a willingness to work together across schools. Thank you to all of the partner schools, teachers and students that give their time and energy to make the transition process so successful at Epping Boys High School.

This begins with the Year 11 (Year 12 2017) parent teacher night on Thursday 27th October 2016. All parent teacher nights next year will use this new system and in order to make a booking you will need to be registered with the school's parent portal.

If you are already registered with the school's parent portal, you will receive an email in the week leading up to any parent teacher night for your son/s which will explain how and when you can make bookings.

If you are NOT registered with the school's parent portal – please follow these steps:

Once you have registered you will receive an email to confirm your access has been approved (Please note this process can take a few days). 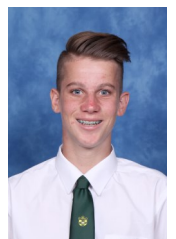


Gordon H – Dragon Boating

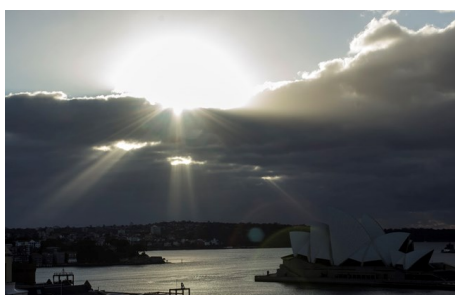


Teaching and learning fun

Some wonderful things are already happening in classrooms. Year 7 Geography students are working through the Global Environments topic, Year 8 are learning about Global Issues and year 9 and 10 are working through respective Australian Geography topics. Year 9 Commerce are learning about effective ways to run a business and year 10 are completing a very important topic based on inquiry based learning about making major decisions in terms of finance, goal setting and making major purchases like a car.

In the topic of Global Environments, 7P had the task of recreating visual representations of environments such as mountains and rainforests. Their challenge was made harder by having to use as many recycled items as they can. This taught the students about the idea of sustainability, as well as reusing everyday household items. The students worked in groups to create their models. Each project demonstrated great planning and a good understanding of how items can be reused, rather than discarded. 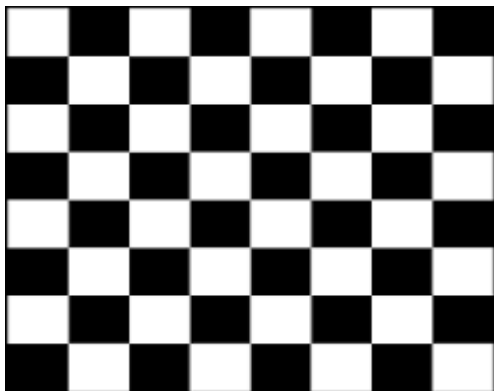

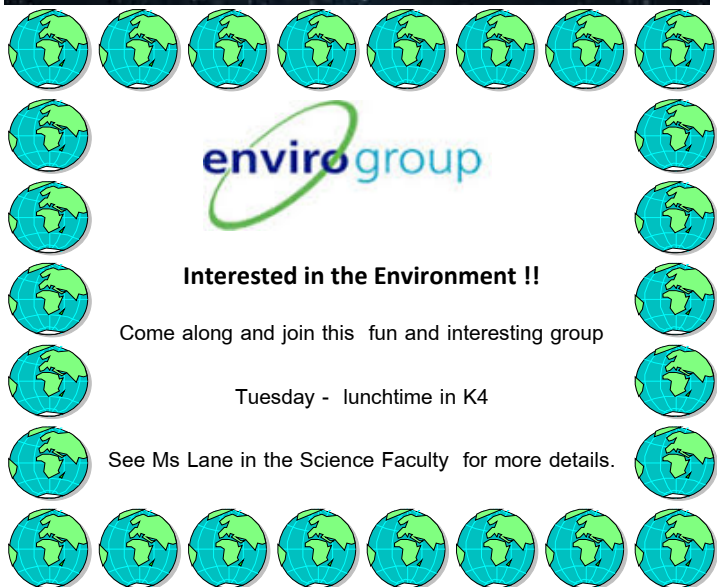
