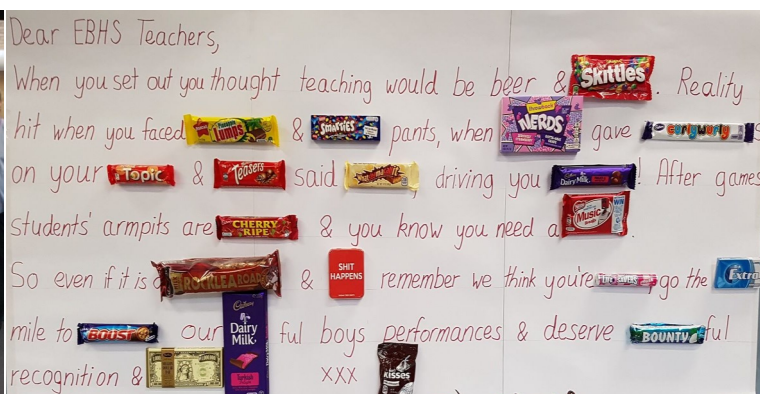

The Higher School Certificate examinations finished on Friday and now students will have the opportunity for rest and recreation prior to the publication of HSC results on Thursday 15 December. On Friday 16 December, we will hold the annual HSC BBQ for students to return, share some stories and meet up once again.

My very best wishes go to all students who have reached a significant milestone in their life. A reminder that as the boys sign out they are to bring all textbooks back, ensure outstanding money owed to the school is paid and collect their reference from Ms Horstead at the end of the process.

At this time of year many of the boys in Year 11 are considering their options for the coming year. Many are reducing their units of study to 10 units for the HSC course. This can be a little risky as there is no safety barrier should something go wrong (best 10 units count). As you can withdraw from a subject up until the HSC exam, it may be preferable to bear with a subject until a definite decision is made.

That said, if a boy is really struggling with a subject, would benefit from putting more time into his other subjects and would suffer less stress and anxiety, then he should definitely withdraw from the concerning subject and use his time wisely to up-skill in his other subjects.

Those boys who have withdrawn from a subject should be reminded that their study period in the Library is just that and should be used constructively to work on their continuing units of study. Students are reminded that they are expected to be in the library for all their study periods, including when they fall in period 4.

Yearly Exams for Year 10 are in Week 6 (14-18 November), so hopefully study timetables and revision are both happening at home and at school in the lead up to these end of year assessment evaluations.

Once again, a reminder that boys can only take a clear pencil case/plastic sleeve into their tests with their writing equipment (this is similar to the HSC requirements). Black pens only are to be used.

Additional English Lessons

Additional English lessons are being offered to assist students in Years 11 and 12 who are doing Standard and Advanced English.

These lessons will be beneficial for revision especially as boys head toward Year 11 exams and the HSC.

We especially encourage boys who would like to improve the quality of their narrative and writing styles to attend.

Making Bullying History – a partnership between Epping Boys High School and Epping North Public School

I would like to thank Mr Kyle Sutton for his energy and commitment in driving the development of a new partnership initiative with Epping North Public School. Ms Joanne Wilcher, Principal of Epping North Public School, highlighted the need to collaboratively develop an initiative that focuses on proactively educating students about bullying. Students from Years 8 and 10 from Epping Boys High School worked with students from Year 5 at Epping North Public School to brainstorm issues around bullying in order to make films to educate and draw attention to bullying and how it can be addressed at school.

The films were viewed at Epping North Public School on Tuesday 1st November and were a great success with students demonstrating a good understanding of how to identify bullying and how to respond to it in a way that is respectful and does not escalate the bullying.

A big thank you to Ms Sarah McLean, Assistant Principal from Epping North Public School, who worked closely with Mr Sutton to develop and deliver the program and to Ms Sarah Laman, a PDHPE teacher from Epping Boys High School, who helped deliver the program.

Next year we hope to work with Cheltenham Girls' High School to further develop this initiative. The program was developed as an extension of the very successful Boys To Men program at Epping Boys High School, coordinated by Mr Kyle Sutton. We see the initiative as part of improving transition from primary to high school and recognise that transition does not just start in Term 3 and end on Orientation Day, but is a part of an extended relationship between primary and high school.

Transition 6 to 7 and Orientation Day

The Year 7 Adviser for 2017 is Mr Cameron Gordon. He has been working hard with the transition team to collate information from primary schools and organise visits to primary school so that Year 6 students can meet students from Epping Boys High School and have the opportunity to ask question about what high school will be like.

Some students are given the opportunity to visit the school prior to Orientation Day to make the process smoother and reduce anxiety around the change.

Orientation Day this year has been moved to the 9th December due to Epping Boys High School's Speech Day at the Town Hall. The organisation for this day is currently happening, led by Ms Ekaterini Thanos. We look forward to meeting the families and students of the 2017 Year 7 cohort.

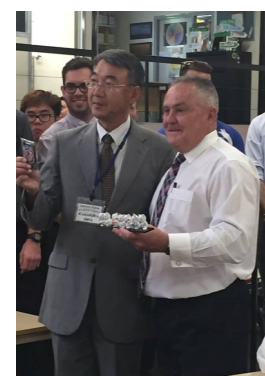
Japanese visit to EBHS – Ben Gibb – Japanese Teacher

News from Social Sciences – Jaye Dunn, Teacher

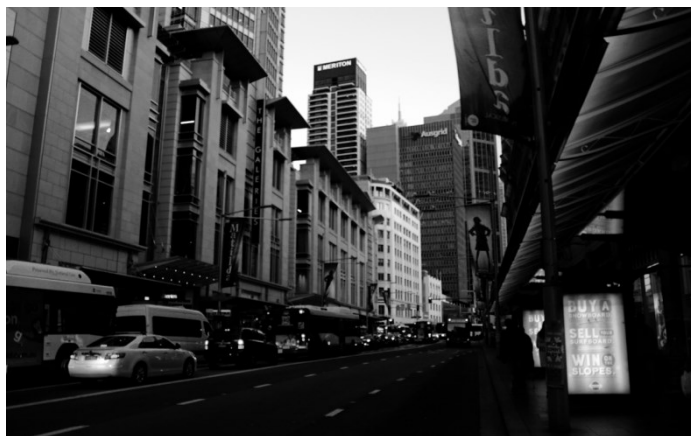
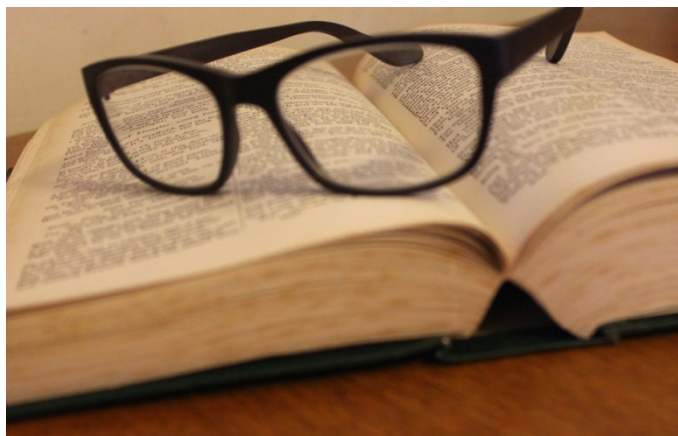
Term 4 is almost half way gone! How quickly time flies! All our HSC boys have completed their Legal Studies, Business Studies, Geography and Economics examinations. We hope all students gave it their best shot and we excitedly await their results and hope they enjoy their well-deserved break.

Co-curricular activities

In Week 3, Year 9 and 10 Commerce students and Year 11 Legal Studies classes were visited by the University of NSW Student Legal Organisation. Law students from UNSW conducted some excellent legal based workshops, giving the students invaluable information and involving them in some interesting workshops, incorporating real life scenarios. Year 9 Commerce learnt about consumer law, Year 10 Commerce learnt about public law and the senior Legal Studies boys received a presentation on police powers, the criminal justice system and young offenders.

The information will be very useful as we move through the first HSC topic of Crime. Students were very engaged in the presentations and thankful for the students of UNSW who had volunteered their time to speak with our students about the law and university studies. Three of our Year 10 boys also participated in the Mini United Nations General Assembly at UNSW in Week 3; a recount of this activity will be included in the next newsletter.

geoSNAPS has continued this term with some excellent entries in the **buildings and books** themed weeks. The buildings week was very tough to judge, as there were so many excellent entries. The winner for buildings was Harry Evenden in Year 10. The books week was won by Cameron Ainslie from 7I. As always, the winning entries along with other honourable mentions are posted on the geoSNAPS noticeboard, opposite H23 in the H block. The winning entries are below.



Teaching and learning

As always, there are some exciting things happening in all our middle and senior school classrooms. The new HSC cohort are getting stuck into their studies and embracing the new challenges facing them in the year ahead.

In Geography, some classes have been completing tasks on the concept of **ecological sustainability**. Year 8 Geography have been making films as part of the final assessment tasks, most of which were excellent and thought-provoking regarding the concept of ecological sustainability. Lachlan Gilbert from 8I had his film selected to be shown as part of the SRC Film Fest. Keeping with the sustainability theme, Year 8 classes, again, will be constructing their own sustainable cities as a final end-of-year project. Using the Sustainable Development goals as a guide and recycled cardboard as their building materials, students are going to conduct some inquiry before building and discover ways to house the world's populations in a sustainable fashion.

Year 9 Commerce boys are enjoying learning about the concept of 'Running a Business' in their lessons. Students are developing their own business, including the product or service and other aspects of being a business owner, such as the development of a business plan. The boys are either sole traders or partnerships and are actively engaged in their businesses and working out the best ways to ensure success and profit and overcome any weaknesses or threats.

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BTM – Kyle Sutton

Year 7

This term Year 7 have been continuing their work on the sustainability group projects, which will be due for marking in Week 6. The Sustainability cross-curriculum project is a compulsory project for all Year 7 students. The project will be facilitated by several days of activities that will build student knowledge about sustainability, as well as ongoing lessons during your BTM periods. The cross-curriculum project will be completed in groups of no more than four students. Year 7 students will learn about sustainability in a range of different situations within the Epping community and how to address these.

Year 8

This term Year 8 have been exploring the issues of social justice and how it looks in the world around them. A highlight of this will be when the boys are exposed to a Hunger banquet which will demonstrate through food, how it is currently proportioned around the world. They will be fed according to their social status which they will receive on the day.

This term there were also a select number of students from Year 8, who previously attended Epping North Primary School (ENPS), who were involved in a mentoring program with the current Year 10 mentors from our school and Year 5 students from their school, with a central focus around bullying. These boys were trained for a full day before attending ENPS, where for the first half of the day, led initiative and team building games and the second half of the day, with the deconstruction of anti-bullying videos. Following the analysis of these videos, mentors helped the Year 5 students develop ideas for a movie they could develop, highlighting the impact around bullying.



The second session was a reflection, watching the movies created by the Year 5 students and a BBQ to celebrate the conclusion of the program until the following year. A job well done from both the Year 8 and Year 10 mentors, well done! Many thanks to Ms Laman and Ralph David for helping out on these days as well as Mrs Mclean from ENPS for her tireless energy and help.



Year 9

This term Year 9 have had a focus around leadership and what will be coming up next as they journey into Senior School. Many of the activities so far have looked at leaders in the past and how influential they have been on our history. They have also been exposed to situations where they need to work as a team, in particular, The Amazing Race. The Amazing Race was held for the second year running with some great success. A special thank you to the Year 10 mentors who were trained and ran the race by themselves. The race began with each class grouped into four equal teams. Each team was given an initial riddle they had to solve which would provide them with instructions on how to get to each station. Each group had to hold a rope between them. Failure to continue to hold the rope would result in a time penalty. The course consisted of 7 different stations, where as a team they had to complete a challenge before their "Plane Ticket" was stamped and the next riddle given to them to find the location of their next station. Students had to use their skills in Morse Code, mathematics, physical challenges such as 7-leg races, Frisbee challenges and a personal favourite from teachers, spinning 10 times and trying to kick a rugby ball over the goals. Each group has taken photos from the day, hopefully these will be uploaded for the day in the proceeding newsletters.

Year 10

The Year 10 mentors have been sensational. The group was divided into two so that half of the group could attend the ENPS mentoring days and the other half for the Amazing Race. It must be noted that the gentlemen involved demonstrated significant skill and ability, leadership and maturity when dealing with younger students both within our own school and ENPS.

They have been complimented by all staff at the primary school, as well as fellow BTM teachers for the way in which they conducted themselves on all of these days. Well done!

Unfortunately, in the second half he injured his hip badly but still managed to force a drop out. Well done, Will.

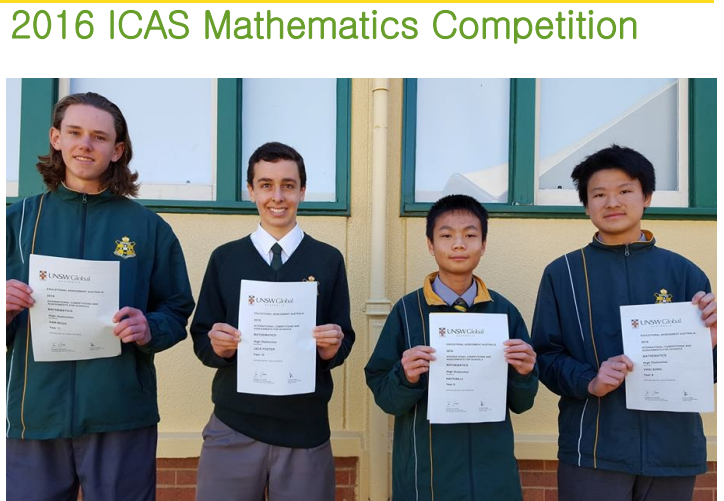


Congratulations to Daivik Julka.

Dear Parents and Carers,

I extend a cordial invitation to you to attend the annual Speech Day of Epping Boys High School. This annual event is a very special occasion to acknowledge our award recipients across the areas of academia, sport, co-curricula, creative arts and community services.

The scheduled starting time of the ceremony in the Sydney Town Hall is 9.45am and it is expected to conclude no later than 12.15pm. Parents and guests are to be seated by 9.40am. There will be a maximum of 400 seats available for parents and community members in the galleries.

Students **will not** be expected to return to school after the ceremony and will only be supervised on the train return journey if requested by parents on the slip below. Students will be dismissed at the Sydney Town Hall at the conclusion of the proceedings.

All students will be transported to the Sydney Town Hall by a special Epping Boys High "express" train. There will be reserved carriage space for parents/carers and friends in carriages 7 and 8. Students will be required to assemble at specific points with nominated staff members. This special train has been pre-paid, so there are no costs involved for parents, friends or students, other than the return fare home.

Where to board: Students should be at the station closest to them **at least 10 minutes** prior to departure time. Students are to follow directions of teachers and prefects at their station.

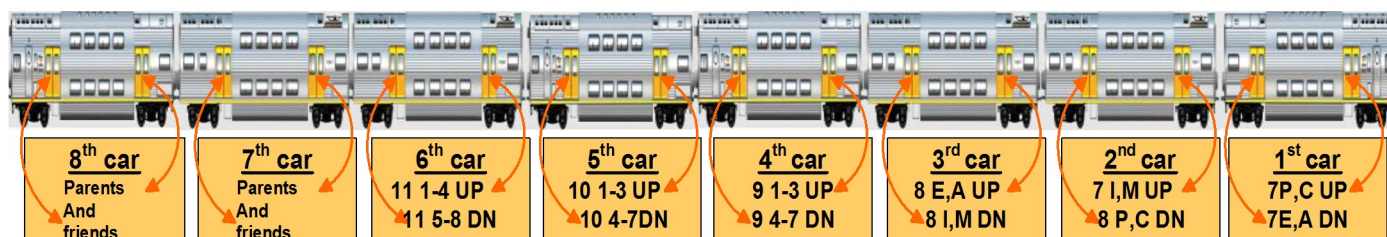

Epping Boys High School Special Charter Train - Boarding guide

- Stay behind platform safe yellow line until train has stopped and doors are opened
- Spread evenly along the platform
- Mindful that customers may unexpectedly get in your way
- Do not run on the platform
- Passengers divided into 2 groups per carriage (8 cars x 2 groups as shown above)
 - Group A Team Leader manages group entry via front doors & proceed Upstairs
 - Group B Team Leader manages group entry via back doors & proceed Downstairs
- Enter carriage doors in an orderly manner and be seated
- Passengers without seat, proceed up or down stairs and stand in the aisle and hold onto an aisle seat to ensure that they don't fall over when the train moves suddenly.

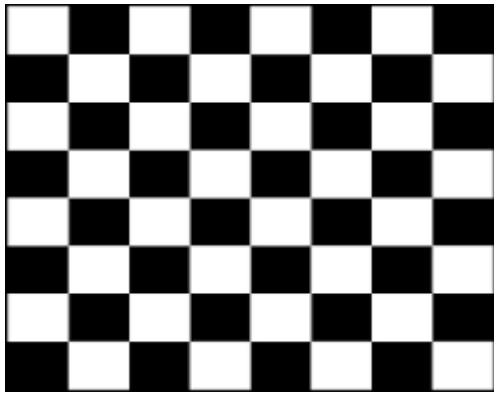

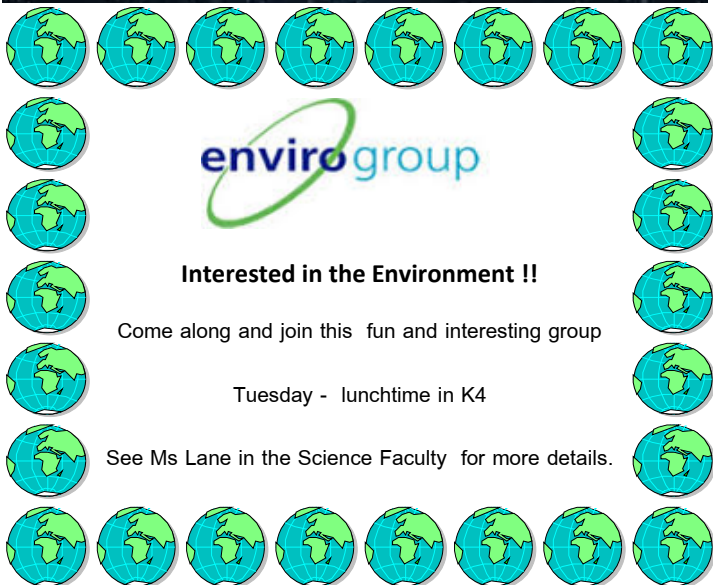
