## From the Relieving Principal – Ralph David

The teachers at Epping Boys High School will be participating in a second professional learning afternoon on the 17 October 2016, from 3:30pm to 6:30pm. A team is currently working on the agenda for the afternoon which will focus on evidence based teaching practice.

Research shows that evidence based teaching strategies are likely to have the largest impact on student results. The work of Professor John Hattie, one of the foremost educational researchers and head of the Australian Institute for Teaching and School Leadership, (AITSL) has brought this term into common use among educators. There are many things that teachers do in the course of teaching, some of which have a greater impact on student learning than others. The goal as an educator is to maximise the impact of teaching by focusing on strategies with a high effect size.

During the afternoon teachers will look closely at teaching practices such as explicit learning intentions, success criteria and timely explicit and feedback can improve student learning outcomes.

During the last professional learning afternoon on the 6 September teachers analysed National Assessment Program Literacy and Numeracy, (NAPLAN) data to find trends in school and student outcomes and begin to discuss strategies support students in the area of writing.

There has been a whole school focus on developing the collaborative practice of teachers. During the professional learning session teachers worked together to plan a lesson observation and reflect upon and review their goals for 2016. The afternoon was very successful with all teachers actively engaged in and positively contributing to the afternoon's activities.

At Epping Boys High School there is rarely a moment to pause. The high levels of participation and engagement of parents' students and teachers make Epping Boys High School the great school that it is. Term three is the term where at times it seems that there are not enough days to encompass all the events. I will not be able to cover everything in the article but I would like to touch on a few highlights. The night of music was simply stunning, offering a showcase of hard work and talent. The drumming performance was clearly a huge hit with its upload to the internet gaining more than 34,000 hits. The Visual Art expo and TAS expo was again fabulous with the ceramic dragons being a clear hit. For a second year running the STEM group joined the evening to demonstrate some of their very creative projects.

Sean Simon, a current Year 12 student, was presented with his prize for winning the school values design competition. Sean's work in developing the posters and promotional material to promote the school values demonstrates a high level of design skill. The school will use this design for class posters that describe the expected behaviours based around the values in the classroom, large banners, pull up foyer banners, lanyards, tie badges and school ties.

Epping Boys high school students from years 7 to 10 compete in the Tournament of Minds Competition. A few years ago one of our teams won the regional competition in the Engineering and Maths category. On Sunday the 11 of September they competed in the state competition. Ms Barui and Ms Wybenga worked with the boys to prepare for the competition. On Sunday they were accompanied by Mr Gibb to the competition.

It is also not appropriate to expect your ill son to travel home alone on public transport with your permission (unless under exceptional circumstances). We have a duty of care to ensure your son is safe.

If your son is sick before the school day commences, please do not send him to school to infect others or to spend his day in the Sick Bay at school as the school policy is that they can only be in Sick Bay for a maximum of 1 period before they must be collected by parents or carers.

## Welfare – Alison Howard, Head Teacher Welfare

### A reminder to parents to notify the school about your child's health

We welcome information from parents about your child's health, even if you are not requesting specific support from our school. Our school asks for medical information when you enrol your child. It is also important that you let us know if your child's health care needs to change or if a new health condition develops.

Information about allergies, medical conditions such as asthma and diabetes and other health care related issues (including prior conditions such as medical procedures in the last 12 months) should be provided to the school by parents. Please provide this information in writing to the Principal. This will greatly assist our school in planning to support your child's health and wellbeing. Please also remember to notify staff in the Administration Office of any changes to your contact details or to the contact details of other people nominated as emergency contacts.

All school staff are required to complete annual training in CPR and Anaphylaxis. This was conducted at the end of Term 4, 2015. Students who have a health condition requiring support at school were sent a letter recently as part of our annual request to updated information. It is important that this is completed and any changes are discussed with our Head Teacher Welfare, Ms Howard.

Parents also need to be aware that any medication administered at school needs to be replaced once expired or used. We appreciate your assistance in this regard and assure you that any information you provide the school will be stored securely and will only be used or disclosed in order to support your son's health needs or as otherwise required by law.

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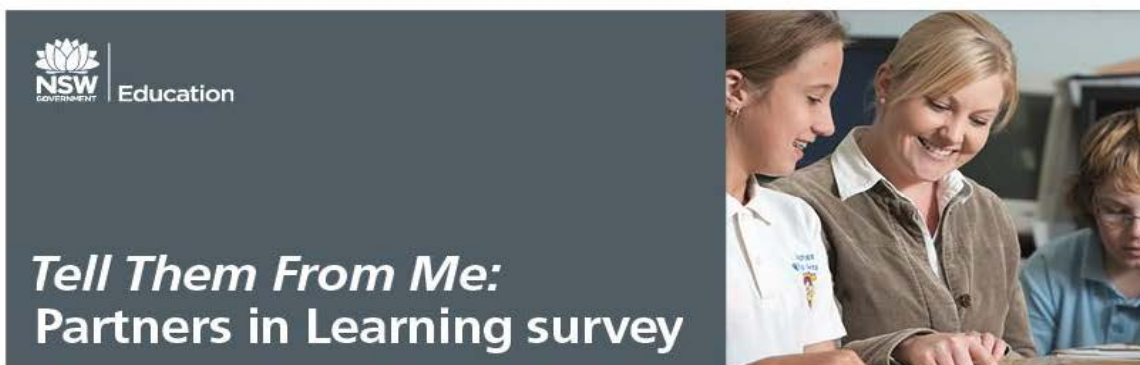

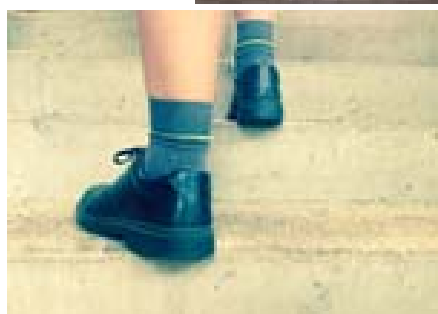


### geoSNAPS!

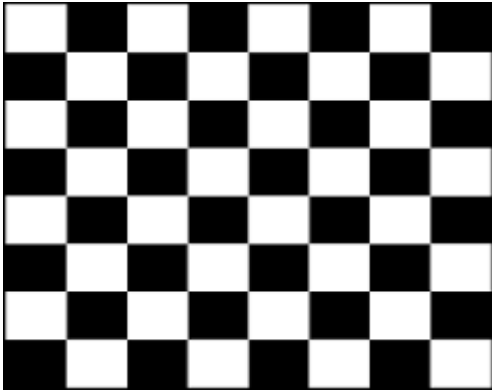
