The HSC is now in its second week and many of the Year 12 boys have been positive about how they have approached their exam preparations. The HSC can be a very stressful time for students and their family's support is crucial to their well-being. A reminder that this is one of many pathways to the future and there are a variety avenues to explore when this year is over. I would like to encourage all the boys to continue studying for the remainder of their exams so they can achieve their best possible result.

Year 11 have stepped up to the mark and started on their own studies to the HSC. Friday of week 1 saw them participate in a study skills day, where they were presented with lots of information to enable them to plan for the year ahead. Assessment booklets were handed out with the Assessment guidelines and all students were encouraged to take these home and go through them with their parents. Parents if you haven't seen them yet they may be at the bottom of a school bag, if you still can't find them the information has also been posted on the school website.

Reports will be given to Year 11 students on Tuesday afternoon followed on Thursday by the final parent teacher interview evening of the year. Please come to the evening and discuss your sons' progress in his HSC subjects. A number of boys are considering dropping down to 10 units of study, my personal opinion is that 12 units gives students more opportunities and also importantly a back-up if something unexpectedly goes awry in one of the courses. The boys should not be in a hurry to drop a subject thinking they will study more for the others, this is too often not the reality. If your son is struggling with a subject he has the option to drop a course right up to the time of his HSC exam so consider carefully before coming to any decisions.

Congratulation to Solomon Hamid who was nominated to enter a competition run by the NSW Constitutional Convention representative, the topic; dual citizenship and parliament. Congratulations also go to Ms Dunn's Legal Studies boys who attended the Macquarie Universities Model United Nations who won the best delegates in a number of categories. It has been a productive and positive start to Term 4 for our boys in the Middle School. Term 4 is, like all terms, incredibly busy. For our Middle School students the focus for this term will be challenging themselves to achieve their very best in their assessment tasks and to ensure that they showcase to their teachers a high level of engagement with learning.

Leaving School Early

Just a reminder about procedures for leaving early which we published earlier this year. We ask all parents and students to ensure that they adhere to the process required for students wanting to leave school early for appointments made during school hours:

- 1. The student is to bring a written note to one of the Deputy Principals **before school** to be signed. An **emailed note or phone call** to the attendance officer can be made by the parent if their son forgets to bring a written note.
- 2. The signed note is presented to the Attendance Officer in the school administration office for an **Early Leave Pass** to be issued.
- 3. This Early Leave Pass is shown to the class teacher at the allocated time to enable the student to sign out at the office and leave school grounds.

Of course we request that where possible **no appointments** are made during lesson time or sport time and that, unless in emergency situations, parents do not turn up at the office to collect students without this process being followed.

Tuesday 5 December 2017 commencing at 9.45am at Sydney Town Hall

Dear Parents and Carers,

I extend a cordial invitation to you to attend the annual Speech Day of Epping Boys High School. This annual event is a very special occasion to acknowledge our award recipients across the areas of academia, sport, co-curricula, creative arts and community services.

The scheduled starting time of the ceremony in the Sydney Town Hall is 9.45am and it is expected to conclude no later than 12.15pm. Parents and quests are to be seated by 9.40am. There will be a maximum of 400 seats available for parents and community members in the galleries.

Students will not be expected to return to school after the ceremony and will only be supervised on the train return journey if requested by parents on the slip below. Students will be dismissed at the Sydney Town Hall at the conclusion of the proceedings and make their own way home.

All students will be transported to the Sydney Town Hall by a special Epping Boys High "express" train. There will be reserved carriage space for parents/carers and friends in carriages 7 and 8. Students will be required to assemble at specific points with nominated staff members. This special train has been pre-paid, so there are no costs involved for parents, friends or students, other than the return fare home.

The group of around 15 boys were assigned with a particular country within the Asian, African and European regions. These countries ranged from Nigeria to China and Qatar to Congo, with the students specifically researching the refugee situation in their respective countries.

As the students were separated in their continent committees, they were tasked with finding a solution for the ongoing refugee problem through discussions and suggestions from representatives. Students collectively brainstormed and proposed possible solutions to specific problems regarding providing health, food, shelter and safety to refugees.

The day was relatively enjoyable and provided an insight to the ongoing refugee crisis throughout the world. Epping Boys was awarded with having the overall best school and the boys appreciated the experience.



NSW Parliament Constitutional Convention

Congratulations to Solomon H of Year 11 Legal Studies. Solomon was selected by the school to apply for the NSW Parliament Constitutional Convention Competition. Almost immediately after arriving we made our way into the gallery of the Legislative Assembly for Question Time, an event in which the NSW Premier and members of the State Government, are asked a series of questions by the Opposition and members of their own party. It was very informative and interesting, and to say the least, entertaining. It was amusing to see dozens of politicians shout over each other and get into heated debates right in front of us.

At some points we all expected some of the ministers to leap over the table and start wrestling but unfortunately no such thing occurred. However, there were a couple of instances in which some of the louder and more disruptive politicians were ejected from the chamber, almost like a timeout for continuously interjecting. Of course the figure behind the ejections was the Honourable Shelley Hancock, an ex high school teacher, whose role in scolding disruptive ministers and keeping order in the chamber reminded us all too much of some of our own teachers in the classroom.

Aside from the theatrics, is was interesting to hear our state leaders comment on significant issues without prior preparation. One question specifically engaged us directly. It concerned the welfare of high school students and how the government planned to support students undergoing the HSC. Unfortunately, we left before we could hear the entirety of the answer. Despite this, it was undeniably a valuable experience to witness first-hand how the major issues concerning our state are dealt with.

Following Question Time we were escorted to the Jubilee Room, one of the most beautiful rooms in the building, for afternoon tea. As a group we quickly devoured the entire Parliament's supply of scones whilst, of course, making time to socialise. We were also joined by Victor Dominello, local Ryde MP, who gave us an insightful speech on leadership and presented us with certificates for attendance. Overall the day was both an exciting and rewarding experience, for us as Prefects, to see first-hand how the heart of NSW politics is operated.

On behalf of the EBHS Prefect body, I would like to thank Mrs Cathy Hartley for organising the event and supervising us on the day, Mr Victor Dominello for giving up his time to meet and talk to us and the staff members of Parliament House who were hospitable and kind enough to offer us the opportunity.
