Leaving School Early

We ask all parents and students to ensure that they adhere to the process required for students wanting to leave school early for appointments made during school hours:

1. The student is to bring a written note to one of the Deputy Principals **before school** to be signed. An **emailed note or phone call** to the attendance officer can be made by the parent if their son forgets to bring a written note.
2. The signed note is presented to the Attendance Officer in the school administration office for an **Early Leave Pass** to be issued.
3. This Early Leave Pass is shown to the class teacher at the allocated time to enable the student to **sign out as the office** and leave school grounds

Of course we request that where possible no appointments are made during lesson time or sport time and that, unless in emergency situations, parents do not turn up at the office to collect students without this process being followed.

NAPLAN

Many of the discussions I have had with students, parents and colleagues in the last few weeks have been around NAPLAN; the testing model, the results and the potential impact on student wellbeing.

Please rest assured that we, as a school, are very aware of these concerns and will ensure that every boy in our school is supported regarding his NAPLAN results. I think it is, however really important to remember that while the NAPLAN testing does provide an incredibly rich source of data regarding individual student performance and that of a cohort it is still a single point of time measurement, that is, one test, on one day.

As a school our planning for academic engagement and targeting improved performance for our students is based on all data we have available to us – the big picture, not just the NAPLAN results. NAPLAN is a valuable part of this big picture, not the only one. As NAPLAN results are made available to schools and families in the next few weeks it is essential that we maintain our collective view of this big picture through celebrating success and planning to address areas needing improvement.

Year 7:

Year 7 students have continued with their mentoring sessions with their year 10 mentors and have continued to learn and sing some of the wonderful songs that will be on display in a few weeks time.

Mentors

Through the mentoring day at E.N.P.S I learned that students in primary school nowadays learn about seven dispositions. The seven dispositions (flexible, resourceful, open-minded...) are a scaffold for thinking effectively. Students apply their knowledge of the seven dispositions in hands-on, interactive activities, namely, the construction of the Rube Goldberg machine, which is a fantastic way of challenging students of all stages to think creatively, resourcefully and flexibly. The Rube Goldberg machine is a contraption that autonomously uses simple chain reactions in a more complex work.

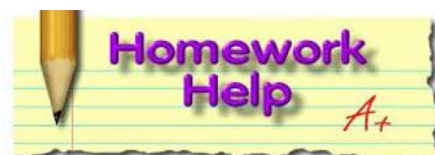
Year 9

New and extended clearways on Epping Road between Epping and Lane Cove North, from Monday 18 September

The NSW Government is acting to reduce congestion and delays by introducing new clearways on Sydney's roads.

Roads and Maritime Services is installing new and extended clearways on Epping Road from Beecroft Road, Epping to Mowbray Road West, Lane Cove North.

We have included a map to show the location of the new and extended clearways.

Supplementing the existing parking restrictions with clearways will help to improve traffic flow and reduce delays by allowing us to tow vehicles that stop illegally or break down. This will ensure all lanes are available to traffic when the road is near capacity.

The new and extended clearways will operate in both directions from:

- 6am to 7pm on weekdays
- 9am to 6pm on weekends and public holidays.

The existing parking restrictions on Epping Road will continue to operate outside these clearway times and the existing bus lanes and transit lanes on Epping Road will continue to operate with no changes.

Changes to the clearways will be operational from **Monday 18 September**. Any vehicles parked in the clearways on or after this date would risk being fined and towed.

What is a clearway?

You must not stop or park on a length of road that is a clearway during its hours of operation. The drivers of public buses and taxis are permitted to stop when dropping off or picking up passengers. If your vehicle is parked in a clearway during its hours of operation, it will be towed, usually to a nearby street and fines apply.

To report a vehicle parked in a clearway or if your vehicle has been towed from a clearway, please call Transport Management Centre on 131 700.

What happens next?

The new clearway signs and posts will be installed between **Friday 1 September** and **Sunday 17 September**, weather permitting. Our working hours will be between **8pm** and **5am** from **Monday** to **Sunday**.

How will the work affect you?

There will be some noise associated with this work but we will do everything we can to minimise its impact, including completing the noisier tasks by **11pm**.

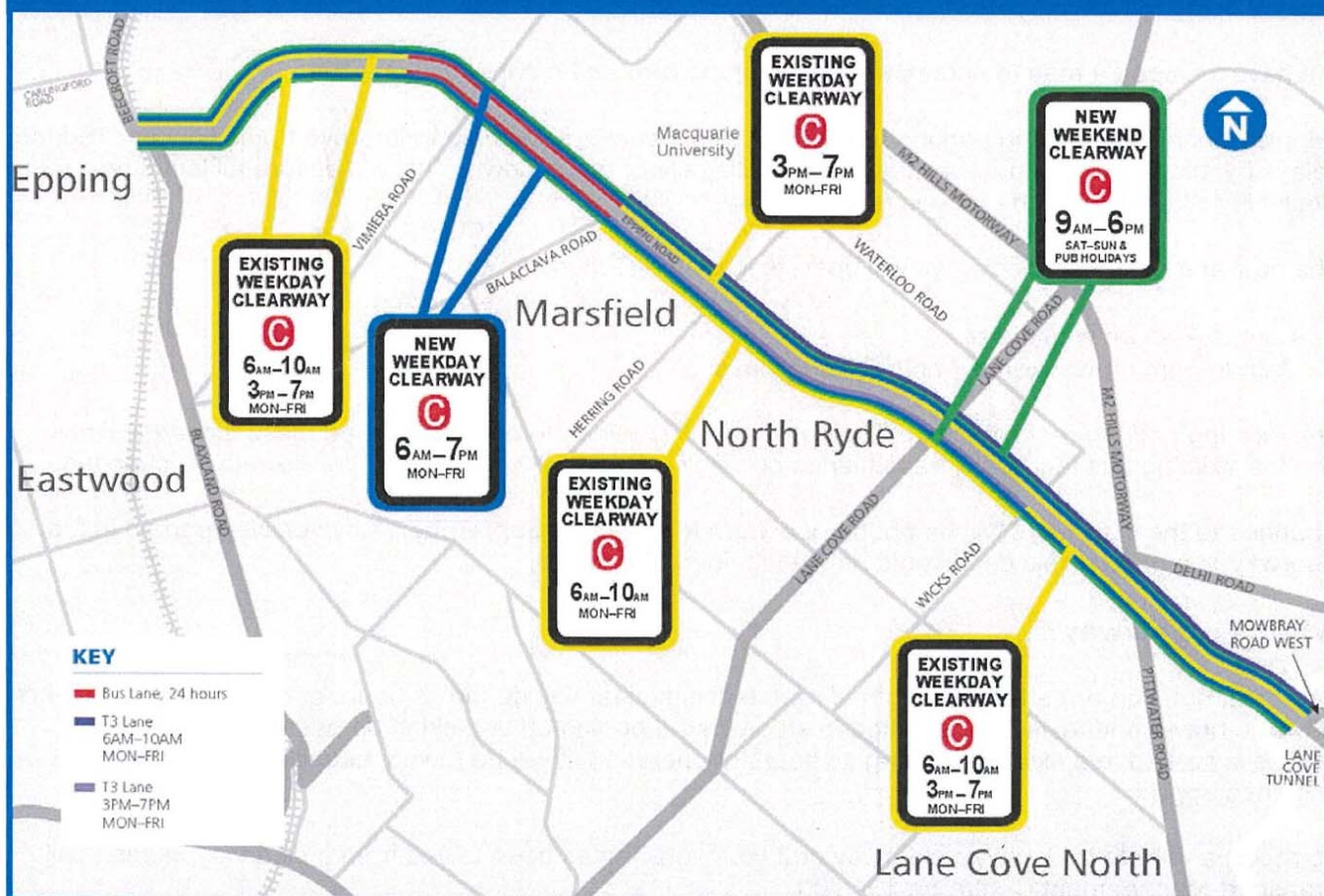

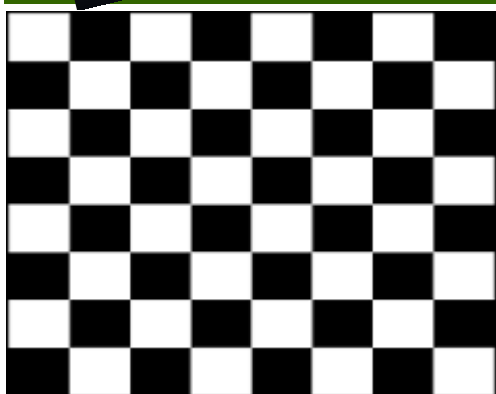
