Some ensembles are also working towards performances at Speech Day on 4 December as well as a variety of Christmas performance opportunities.





Year 10 Geography Excursion

Willoughby Girls' High School Geography Excursion

The Year 10 Geography excursion to Willoughby Girls' High School was a resounding success. The excursion was for our Assessment Task based on our main topic: Human Wellbeing. The excursion involved students interviewing the Willoughby Girls and asking them questions about wellbeing and ways to improve wellbeing, based on our research beforehand. The excursion took place at Willoughby Girls' High School on Monday 27August. We had three sessions of 'question time' with a mix of Year 9 and 10 classes from Willoughby. Vaccination/immunisation update

The **Northern Sydney Public Health Unit will** be visiting Epping Boys in Week 4, 9 November 2018.

The nurses unit has informed the school that their most recent visit uptake rates for Meningococcal vaccines for 2018, were lower than expected for EBHS. Year 10-80% and Year 11-44%

They would like to offer the opportunity to vaccinate Year 11 and Year 10 students when they return for the final Year 7 vaccination clinic on Friday 9th November.

If all boys requiring vaccination could kindly return their form to the administration office before then, it will assist in ensuring enough vaccines are available on the day.

We will be running the LIFE READY COURSE for Year 10 students in Week 7. Life Ready is a mandatory 25 hour course for all students in government schools and replaces the *Crossroads program* as a prerequisite for the HSC. The course reflects a renewed focus on students confidently and successfully transitioning to post-school employment/study, participation and independence in addition to the existing focus on preparing senior students to lead, and contribute to, healthy, safe and meaningful lives as they prepare to exit the NSW Government schooling system. Information regarding this program and the Year 10 Camp was sent home in Week 2. Students are required to attend all sessions of this mandatory program. The Year 10 Camp to Coolendell will take place in Week 8, 5 – 7 December.

A reminder to all parents that summer is now upon us. Students are advised to wear a school cap and sunscreen for recess and lunch, and bring a refillable water bottle to access our refrigerated bubblers

Information about Speech Day

Tuesday 4 December 2018 commencing at 9.45am at Sydney Town Hall

Dear Parents and Carers,

I extend a cordial invitation to you to attend the annual Speech Day of Epping Boys High School. This annual event is a very special occasion to acknowledge our award recipients across the areas of academia, sport, co-curricula, creative arts and community services.

The scheduled starting time of the ceremony in the Sydney Town Hall is 9.45am and it is expected to conclude no later than 12.15pm. Parents and guests are to be seated by 9.40am. There will be a maximum of 400 seats available for parents and community members in the galleries.

Students <u>will not</u> be expected to return to school after the ceremony and will only be supervised on the train return journey if requested by parents on the slip below. Students will be dismissed at the Sydney Town Hall at the conclusion of the proceedings and make their own way home.

All students will be transported to the Sydney Town Hall by a special Epping Boys High "express" train. There will be reserved carriage space for parents/carers and friends in carriages 7 and 8. Students will be required to assemble at specific points with nominated staff members. This special train has been pre-paid, so there are no costs involved for parents, friends or students, other than the return fare home.

Train arrives: Sydney Town Hall 9.30 am

Where to board: Students should be at the station closest to them at least 10 minutes prior to departure time.
