Teens receive powerful messages from adults in their lives, (parents, elderly family members, sport coaches, teachers, etc...) for some, the messages have encouraged and supported them, and as a result make them feel secure. Others may hear mostly critiquing, shaming and intimidating comments and as a result struggle to build good relationships with adults. In some cases adults look to teens for support, both appropriate and inappropriate for their age. In most cases this is a good scenario in which teens tend to be more mature in their decision making and approach to all aspects of life. They may however, not have the opportunity to be what they are, children, and are so involved in taking care of others they may not know how to ask for help to have their own needs met.

Having a safe place to talk about life and relationships is necessary for nurturing confidence, patience and tolerance. Genuine open dialogue at home or school can help boys feel less lonely and different by knowing others with similar struggles. These indirect conversations about how things are going may assist students in having a positive outlook, be more confident and better negotiate a complex period in their life.

At Epping mentoring and communication is of the utmost importance to the ongoing development of fine young men. Supporting this process at home can be as simple as a chat over breakfast or dinner, enquiring conversation whilst in the car or informal talks whilst at sport. Engaging in conversational topics which is of interest to your son is important to maintain open channels for communication. Not to question or judge is our toughest challenge, but to allow them to talk without interruption is key to finding out what is going on in 'that mind'.

I look forward to seeing all parents and guardians at parent teacher night this term.

Significant information has been emailed home to parents and is available through the SENTRAL Parent Portal. We wish Year 7 and Year 9 well during the NAPLAN testing process.

ANZAC Day - Aida Ghorayeb, Prefect Adviser

This ANZAC Day, the Epping Boys Prefects attended a variety of memorials in the local community: Epping, West Ryde and Beecroft. Four of our boys attended the Beecroft service. To begin the service, we marched down the path to the Cenotaph following behind the local cadet and scout groups. The service consisted of speeches from ex-military servicemen and their families, as well as the singing of both the Australian and the New Zealand national anthems. The main speech of the memorial provided a history to the renowned "Last Post". They spoke of its origins as an announcement signifying the end of day for the soldiers, allowing them to 'rest in safety'. Soon, it had transformed into a song played on the battleships of soldiers returning home from war, and eventually began to be played at burial ceremonies, the last sound to be heard before the soldiers were allowed to 'rest in peace'.

At the end of the service, the Prefects joined in with others at the event to lay a wreath at the base of the Cenotaph and paid our respects with the playing of the last post and then a minute's silence followed by "the Rouse". Light refreshments served at the community hall across the street where we were able to converse with the many attendees of the service, including some Epping old boys.

On Wednesday, May 1st 2019, Year 11 Legal Studies students participated in the NSW Law Society Mock Trial against Turramurra High School. Our team was the Defense in a criminal trial of a common assault case. The team analysed the Crimes Act and a set of precedent cases to argue the defence case, in front of a real court magistrate.

Liam and Jack did a stellar job as the barristers arguing the case and questioning the witnesses. They were accompanied by Sam 2 as the instructing solicitor to defend Luke as the defendant. Tom was our second witness and Sam 1 did an outstanding job as the court officer. Whilst we didn't win the trial, the team did an excellent job of representing the school and the Legal Studies cohort

We were fortunate enough to participate in the Mock Trial and learn the way that a court room operates. The trial was presided over by a lawyer who works for Legal Aid. He gave the team excellent advice on the ways to prepare for the next trial. The team did the school proud by engaging in the trial with enthusiasm and gained valuable skills in relation to Legal Studies, teamwork and communication. Our next Trial is on Wednesday 22nd of May. We will be the Plaintiff in a civil trial. We look forward to using the feedback from our magistrate to improve our performance and hopefully win the next trial.

As the new Sydney Metro Norwest will open on 26th May, 2019, there will be some changes to Hillsbus public routes. Route M60 will be renumbered to 600. The services remain unchanged.

- Route M61 will be renumbered to 610X. The services remain unchanged.
- Route 604 will operate through Hills Showground Station.
- New Route 617 operates between Adelphi St, Rouse Hill, Beaumont Hills and Kellyville Station.
- Route 619 will operate through Hills Showground Station.
- Route 626 will not operate to James Henty Dr and Jenner Rd, and it will be extended to Kellyville Station via Cherrybrook Station and Castle Hill.
- Route 633 will operate via Victoria Rd and Castle Hill Rd to Cherrybrook Station and Castle Hill Station. I
- Route 635 will operate via Coonara Ave to Cherrybrook Station and Anglican Retirement Village to Castle Hill. It will no longer operate via Ellerslie Dr.
- Route 714 will commence and terminate at Norwest Station.
- Route T60 will operate through Norwest Station via Barina Downs Rd and Reston Grange.




