#### School Drop-off and Pick up Arrangements

Epping Boys High School is a very busy School, with more than 1200 boys entering and exiting the school at peak times before and after school. To keep your sons safe, we all need to follow some simple

While we encourage the boys to make their own way to and from school to encourage responsibility and self-sufficiency, we understand that it is not always possible. From time to time you may need to drop him off or pick him up from school.

If you are going to drop off or pick your son up before or after school please ensure

- Do not drive into the school grounds between 7:30-9:30 am and 2:45-4:00pm, unless due to exceptional circumstances such as your son is carrying a heavy musical instrument or has an injury
- Do not stop in the Bus Zone
- - Do drop your son past the school gate on Vimiera Road at a safe place. A popular and safe option for dropping and picking your son up from school is in the Car Park at Marsfield Park located opposite the school on Vimiera Road.

## BTM (Boys to Men) and Wellbeing - Cameron Gordon, Head Teacher Wellbeing

BTM is an excellent opportunity for students to gain a greater understanding of who they are, what they represent and how they can impact positively on the community, both locally and at home. I highly encourage students and parents to actively engage in the program and discuss lesson content at home each fortnight to appreciate the values that we teach at Epping Boys High School and the values we uphold in the Epping community.

The Year 10 Mentors were selected at the end of 2018. The mentors have an essential role in the BTM program, whereby they are there from the beginning with our Year 7 students offering support and direction through the early years of their schooling. It is our belief that the mentors will continue to guide these Year 7's throughout their schooling until they reach the end of their middle schooling and hopefully, they become mentors themselves.

Year 7 have commenced their journey into secondary school with school camp in Week 2. This is an amazing opportunity for each boy to get to know each other outside of the school context. The Year 10 mentors assisted with the transition period for our Year 7 students with several 'getting to know you' games and tours of the school at the Orientation Day and on their first day. It is hoped that positive bonds between mentors and mentees has already started to develop.


